Q. What would it be like to go to college if you want a job in computer technology?

A. What a lot of people don't realize about working in the tech industry is that it is important to have knowledge in areas outside of technology. Most people who want a job in tech study something like Computer Science or Software Engineering in college. 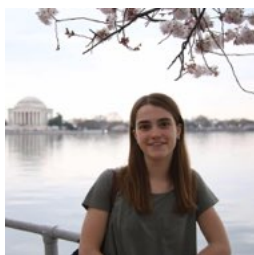


Q. Do you have to pay for lunch?

A. Most schools require that you buy a meal plan as a part of your tuition. You pay for the school to provide you a certain number of meals, and then the school loads all of that money onto your school ID, so you just swipe your ID to pay for your food. So, yes you pay for your food, but you pay for it all at the beginning of the semester and then use your ID instead of cash on a day-to-day basis.

Q. Is it harder to go to college in another country?

A. Yes, it might be a little harder to find out how to go to college in another country, but usually counselors or online programs can help you find a way to figure out school wherever you want to go! The application process for international schools tends to be a little different. For example, international schools may require different admissions tests.
